
Penta Policy Insiders Michigan Insights Review Series **Corporate Social Responsibility** Published February 2023

Executive Summary

We are excited to share findings from our second annual Michigan Insights Review. From March to May 2022, we surveyed and spoke with over 250 state and local policymakers in Michigan to understand policy priorities throughout the state and how the private and public sector can work on those issues.

While healthcare remains a top priority for Michigan policymakers, focus this year has shifted to infrastructure and education, as decision-makers grapple with questions around how to rebuild the state in a post-pandemic world.


Following a consequential midterm election, Michigan policymakers are aware that their constituents will be looking to them to work with the private sector to solve the issues they prioritized during their reelection campaigns. As leaders return to in-person engagement, policymakers want to see the private sector engaging on these foundational issues, placing an emphasis on direct collaboration with stakeholders, in order to benefit both local communities and the state as a whole.



This is the final report in a series that examines Michigan policymakers' top policy priorities of 2022. This review examines Corporate Social Responsibility and Public-Pricate Collaboration in the state.

Michigan Deep Dive: Corportate Social Responsibility and Public-Private Collaboration



87% of policymakers across the political spectrum value when the private sector commits to corporate social responsibility initiatives, such as giving back to the community or ensuring the individuals in their workforce are treated fairly.

Good Corportate Citizens Take Responsibility

"...What makes them a good corporate citizen is when they can see the bigger picture and they're focused on the longevity of their efforts and not just the short term. I think that they need to be taking responsibility for not only what they provide, but also the costs that others incur because of them, whether it's externalities, like pollution, or pay policies that shift some of the burden onto taxpayers or others."

Companies Should Be Willing to Help Out

"Every business that does business in the county, however or whatever jurisdiction you have, it needs to be a community benefit plan in place."

Michigan Deep Dive: Corportate Social Responsibility and Public-Private Partnerships

Going forward, policymakers want to see the private sector collaborate on various issues ranging from economic development to environmental responsibility.

Partnerships Require Engagement

"When you bring the partners to the table, then the conversation can begin...But if we don't include those people, then we never know...when you engage other businesses and organizations and you get their input and their feedback, you'd be surprised what they're buying into."

Economic Development

"I would like to see the private sector look more seriously at the benefits of relocating here, but then also engaging in that conversation with policymakers of how to create the environment that would actually draw them in...I value public-private partnerships that ultimately benefit everybody and not just benefit a small group of folks."

Public-Private Partnerships in Infrastructure

"When we have private businesses collaborate with us, it is often on a philanthropic basis...One exciting avenue that I'm seeing for collaboration going forward with the private sector is making investments in the infrastructure to continue to be at the forefront of having really well run streets with maintenance."

Affordable Housing Needs to be Built

"People can't find accessible affordable housing. People are sleeping on couches, becoming homeless, living in really substandard situations because there's not enough accessible affordable housing... The isolation that comes from that is so damaging to people's physical and mental health... We need more homes for regular people with families with children and multi-generational families."


